9 **TO SUPPORT THE ESTABLISHMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE TIGER**

12 **PARAGRAPH 1:** WHEREAS, CURRENTLY THERE IS THE COMMITMENT TO
13 COMMUNITY THAT ENCOURAGES TRUTH, LEARNING AND
14 THE HIGHEST PREFORMANCE IN ACADEMIC AND SOCIAL
15 ENVIRONMENTS, AND;

17 **PARAGRAPH 2:** WHEREAS, THE TIGER CREED SHALL BE AN HONOR CODE
18 THAT WILL INSTILL A SENSE OF ACADEMIC PRIDE IN
19 STUDENTS, FACULTY AND STAFF, AND;

21 **PARAGRAPH 3:** WHEREAS, THE TIGER CREED SHALL ACT IN
22 CONJUNCTION TO THE COMMITMENT TO THE COMMUNITY
23 TO FURTHER ENCOURAGE ACADEMIC INTERGIRY
24 THROUGHOUT THE UNIVERSITY, AND;

26 **PARAGRAPH 4:** WHEREAS, THE FACULTY SENATE SUPPORTS THE TIGER
27 CREED AND WILL BE WRITING ITS OWN RESOLUTION, AND;

29 **PARAGRAPH 5:** WHEREAS, THE TIGER CREED SHALL READ AS FOLLOWS

31 **Title:** LSU Tiger Creed

32
33 **PURPOSE:** The purpose of this shall be to establish an LSU Academic Creed for the University in
34 order to cultivate an atmosphere of academic integrity in association with our Commitment to
35 Community, to represent the passion of "loving purple, living gold" and upholding the excellence
36 of LSU.

38 **BODY:**

39 "We, the students, faculty, and staff of Louisiana State University Agricultural and Mechanical
40 College, agree to uphold the following principles herein listed within this Creed in a united effort
41 to maintain a philosophy of academic honesty, betterment and accountability for all those within
42 the LSU community.

44 We, the students, vow to act honorably in all academic coursework. As such:

- 45 1) We agree to neither give nor receive unpermitted aid in examinations, reports, or
46 any other work that is subject to the basis of grading.
47 2) We agree to actively take part in upholding our neighbors to such a standard
48 prescribed in this Creed, including but not limited to, the reporting of any violations
49 in the spirit of this Code.

50
51 We, the faculty and staff, vow to have utter confidence in the honor of all students. As such:



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- 1) We agree to refrain from pursuing unreasonable precautions to prevent forms of academic dishonesty and to maintain a level of trust and honor of the students' commitment to this code.
- 2) We encourage methods of testing that foster upholding these principles listed within this Code.

Violations of these above principles will be considered a violation of this Creed. Students, faculty and staff may report any offense of this type to Student Advocacy and Accountability. Not reporting a potential violation of this Creed in itself shall not be considered a violation to this Code; however, any violation of the Tiger Creed shall be subject to the same accountability as the Code of Conduct.

The establishment of this Creed acknowledges that all students, faculty and staff of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College agree to commit to excellence and honor at all academic levels as well as personal integrity and responsibility.

Statement of acknowledgement of this Creed:

'On my honor, I affirm that I have upheld the standards listed within the Tiger Creed and that my academic work is the product of my sole unaided efforts.'

PROCEDURES:

This Tiger Creed shall be implemented immediately upon its approval. Students shall be instructed on this Tiger Creed during their respective orientation period.

The Tiger Creed can be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the Tiger Creed Committee. The Tiger Creed Committee can be convened at the request of the Director of Student Advocacy and Accountability or the Dean of Students. SAA and/or the Dean of Students shall outline the structuring of this committee.

PARAGRAPH 6: THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LOUISIANA STATE UNIVERSITY AND AGRICULTURAL AND MECHANICAL COLLEGE STUDENT SENATE THAT THIS BODY SUPPORTS THE ESTABLISHMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE LSU TIGER CREED, AND


PARAGRAPH 7: BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE TRANSMITTED TO PRESIDENT-CHANCELLOR F. KING ALEXANDER, PROVOST STUART BELL, DEAN OF STUDENTS K.C. WHITE, ASSOCIATE DEAN OF STUDENTS MATT GREGORY AND THE FACULTY SENATE.

PARAGRAPH 8: THIS RESOLUTION SHALL TAKE EFFECT UPON PASSAGE BY A SIMPLE MAJORITY (1/2) VOTE OF THE LSU STUDENT SENATE AND SIGNATURE BY THE PRESIDENT, UPON LAPSE OF TIME FOR PRESIDENTIAL ACTION, OR IF VETOED BY THE PRESIDENT AND SUBSEQUENTLY APPROVED BY THE SENATE, ON THE DATE OF SUCH APPROVAL.


