8 TO THANK THE MEMBERS OF THE SOUTHERN ASSOCIATION OF COLLEGES AND  
9 SCHOOLS – COMMISSION OF COLLEGES (SACS-COC) AND QUALITY ENHANCEMENT  
10 PLAN (QEP) TEAM.

11 PARAGRAPH 1: WHEREAS, SACS-COC IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REAFFIRMATION  
12 OF ACCREDITATION FOR LOUISIANA STATE UNIVERSITY WHICH  
13 ALLOWS LSU STUDENTS TO GRADUATE FROM AN “ACCREDITED  
14 INSTITUTION”; AND,

15 PARAGRAPH 2: WHEREAS, THE REAFFIRMATION OF ACCREDITATION HAS BEEN A  
16 VERY LONG PROCESS WHICH IS SET TO CONCLUDE BY DECEMBER  
17 OF 2014, AND;

18 PARAGRAPH 3: WHEREAS, THE QEP IS A PLAN TO “IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING  
19 OR THE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT ON CAMPUS” THROUGHOUT  
20 THE FIVE YEARS AFTER THE REAFFIRMATION OF ACCREDITATION,  
21 AND;

22 PARAGRAPH 4: WHEREAS, THE STUDENTS OF LSU WOULD BE AT A HUGE  
23 DISADVANTAGE IF NOT FOR THE EFFORTS OF THE SACS-COC  
24 AND QEP TEAM, AND;

25 PARAGRAPH 5: WHEREAS, MANY STUDENTS AND FACULTY HAVE PUT SEVERAL  
26 YEARS INTO THIS TEAM AND WILL CONTINUE TO DO SO TO  
27 MAINTAIN THE “PRINCIPLES OF ACCREDITATION”, AND;

28 PARAGRAPH 6: WHEREAS, A SPECIAL THANKS IS EXTENDED TO THE DIRECTOR OF  
29 REAFFIRMATION OF ACCREDITATION, DR. DARRELL HENRY, AND  
30 THE CHAIR OF THE QEP TEAM, DR. CAROL O’NEIL.

31 PARAGRAPH 7: THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LOUISIANA  
32 STATE UNIVERSITY AGRICULTURAL AND  
33 MECHANICAL COLLEGE STUDENT SENATE THAT WE  
34 THANK EACH MEMBER OF THE SACS-COC AND QEP TEAM.
