A RESOLUTION

TO URGE AND REQUEST THE LSU OFFICE OF PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION TO PLACE SIGNS AT THE ON CAMPUS BUS STOPS INDICATING THE BUSSING SCHEDULE

PARAGRAPH 1: WHEREAS, LSU CONTRACTS WITH CAPITAL AREA TRANSIT SYSTEM (CATS) TO PROVIDE BUS SERVICE FOR STUDENTS, FACULTY, STAFF, AND VISITORS BOTH ON AND OFF CAMPUS, AND

PARAGRAPH 2: WHEREAS, THE BUSSING SHCEDULE CHANGES DEPENDING ON THE TIME OF OPERATION, AND

PARAGRAPH 3: WHEREAS STUDENTS WAITING AT BUS STOPS ARE OFTEN UNAWARE THAT BUSES CHANGE ROUTES AND TIMES OF OPERATION DAILY, AND

PARAGRAPH 4: WHEREAS CREATING AWARENESS OF THESE TIMES OF OPERATION BY PLACING BUS SCHEDULE MARQUEES AT EVERY ON CAMPUS BUS STOP LOCATION WILL PREVENT THIS CONFUSION, AND

PARAGRAPH 5: WHEREAS THE SIGNS WILL BE USED TO MAKE KNOWN THE CURRENT BUS ROUTES AND TIMES OF OPERATION CURRENTLY IN PLACE BY THE LSU OFFICE OF PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION.

PARAGRAPH 6: BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT A SUITABLE COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE TRANSMITTED TO GARY GRAHAM AND COREY WEBER IN A TIMELY AND APPROPRIATE MANNER.

PARAGRAPH 7: THIS BILL SHALL TAKE EFFECT UPON A PASSAGE BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE LSU STUDENT SENATE AND SIGNATRE BY THE PRESIDENT, UPON A LAPSE OF TIME FOR PRESIDENTIAL ACTION, OR IF VETOED BY THE PRESIDENT AND SUBSEQUENTLY APPROVED BY THE SENATE, ON THE DATE OF SUCH APPROVED.
