A BILL

TO APPROPRIATE SIX HUNDRED ONE DOLLARS (\$601.00) TO THE MANSHIP SCHOOL OF MASS COMMUNICATION ADVERTISING FEDERATION CLUB TO COVER THE LODGING AND REGISTRATION EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH SENDING ITS WINNING ADVERTISING CAMPAIGN TEAM TO THE 7TH DISTRICT ADVERTISING COMPETITION IN CHATTANOOGA, TENNESSEE.

PARAGRAPH 1: WHEREAS, THIS EVENT WILL HIGHLIGHT THE WORK OF LSU STUDENTS AT A REGIONAL ADVERTISING COMPETITION, AND

PARAGRAPH 2: WHEREAS, THIS EVENT ENHANCES LSU'S ACADEMIC PROMINENCE AND OFFERS PRACTICAL EXPERTISE THAT THE LSU DELEGATES WILL IMPART TO THEIR FELLOW STUDENTS UPON RETURNING TO LSU, AND

PARAGRAPH 3: WHEREAS, FUNDS HAVE BEEN SECURED FOR FOOD AND TRANSPORTATION COSTS, AND

PARAGRAPH 4: WHEREAS, IN PARTICIPATING IN THIS YEAR'S 7TH DISTRICT ADVERTISING COMPETITION WILL FURTHER ASSURE THE CONTINUED HONORS OF THE ADVERTISING FEDERATION CLUB, THE MANSHIP SCHOOL OF MASS COMMUNICATION, AND LOUISIANA STATE UNIVERSITY.

PARAGRAPH 5: THEREFORE, THE LSU A&M STUDENT SENATE HEREBY APPROPRIATES SIX HUNDRED ONE DOLLARS (\$601.00) TO THE MANSHIP SCHOOL OF MASS COMMUNICATION ADVERTISING FEDERATION CLUB TO COVER THE LODGING AND REGISTRATION EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH SENDING ITS WINNING ADVERTISING CAMPAIGN TEAM TO THE 7TH DISTRICT ADVERTISING COMPETITION IN CHATTANOOGA, TENNESSEE.

PARAGRAPH 6: ALL MONIES NOT USED SHALL REVERT TO THE GENERAL CONTINGENCY. THIS BILL SHALL BECOME NULL AND VOID AS OF JUNE 30, 2000.
