A BILL

TO SEVEN HUNDRED FORTY DOLLARS (\$740.00) TO THE LSU CHAPTER OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF COLORED PEOPLE (NAACP) TO HELP DEFRAY THE COST OF PURCHASING CURRICULUM MATERIALS TO ESTABLISH A MENTORING PROGRAM AT UNIVERSITY TERRACE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL.

PARAGRAPH 1: WHEREAS, THE LSU NAACP IS CURRENTLY IN THE PROCESS OF ESTABLISHING A MENTORING PROGRAM AT UNIVERSITY TERRACE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL OPEN FOR PARTICIPATION TO THE ENTIRE LSU STUDENT BODY, AND

PARAGRAPH 2: WHEREAS, THE LSU NAACP CURRENTLY COVERS ALL OTHER CHAPTER EXPENSES, AND

PARAGRAPH 3: WHEREAS, THE LSU NAACP SEEKS TO INCREASE ITS INVOLVEMENT WITH BOTH THE BATON ROUGE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE AND A MORE DIVERSE PORTION OF THE LSU STUDENT BODY, AND

PARAGRAPH 4: WHEREAS, THIS ENDEAVOR WILL NOT ONLY BENEFIT THE STUDENTS OF UNIVERSITY TERRACE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BUT WILL ALSO POSITIVELY MARKET BOTH THE LSU NAACP AND MORE IMPORTANTLY LOUISIANA STATE UNIVERSITY TO A SECTION OF THE COMMUNITY OFTEN NEGLECTED.

PARAGRAPH 5: THEREFORE, THE LSU A&M STUDENT SENATE HEREBY APPROPRIATES SEVEN HUNDRED FORTY DOLLARS (\$740.00) TO THE LSU NAACP TO HELP DEFRAY THE COST OF PURCHASING CURRICULUM MATERIALS TO ESTABLISH A MENTORING PROGRAM AT UNIVERSITY TERRACE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL.

PARAGRAPH 6: ALL MONIES NOT USED SHALL REVERT BACK TO THE GENERAL CONTINGENCY. THIS BILL SHALL BECOME NULL AND VOID AS OF JUNE 30, 1999.
