A BILL

TO APPROPRIATE SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHTY-THREE DOLLARS (\$783.00) TO THE POLITICAL SCIENCE GRADUATE STUDENT ASSOCIATION TO HELP DEFRAY THE COST OF SPONSORING THE SYMPOSIUM ON JOHN PAUL II'S ENCYCLICAL, "FAITH AND REASON."

- PARAGRAPH 1:** WHEREAS, ON MONDAY, APRIL 26, THE POLITICAL SCIENCE GRADUATE STUDENT ASSOCIATION (PSGSA) IS SPONSORING A SYMPOSIUM ON "FAITH AND REASON," AND
- PARAGRAPH 2:** WHEREAS, THE EVENT WILL BE OPEN TO ALL LSU STUDENTS, AND
- PARAGRAPH 3:** WHEREAS, THIS EVENT DOES NOT ADVOCATE A PARTICULAR RELIGIOUS VIEWPOINT, BUT FOSTERS AN ACADEMIC DIALOGUE, AND
- PARAGRAPH 4:** WHEREAS, THE PSGSA HAS INVITED ROBERT GEORGE, A NATIONALLY PROMINENT EXPERT IN NATURAL LAW THEORY TO ADDRESS THE SYMPOSIUM, AND
- PARAGRAPH 5:** WHEREAS, THE PSGSA HAS RAISED MORE THAN TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$2,500) FOR THE SYMPOSIUM AND SECURED FUNDING FOR ALL TRAVEL EXPENSES FOR MR. GEORGE, AND
- PARAGRAPH 6:** WHEREAS, PUBLICITY IS ESSENTIAL TO THE SUCCESS OF THE SYMPOSIUM.
- PARAGRAPH 7:** THEREFORE, THE LSU A&M STUDENT SENATE HEREBY APPROPRIATES SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHTY-THREE DOLLARS (\$783.00) TO THE POLITICAL SCIENCE GRADUATE STUDENT ASSOCIATION TO HELP DEFRAY THE COST OF SPONSORING THE SYMPOSIUM ON JOHN PAUL II'S ENCYCLICAL, "FAITH AND REASON."
- PARAGRAPH 8:** ALL MONIES NOT USED SHALL REVERT TO THE GENERAL CONTINGENCY. THIS BILL SHALL BECOME NULL AND VOID AS OF JUNE 30, 1999.
