**A RESOLUTION**

TO EXPRESS SUPPORT FOR THE SOCIETY FOR EQUAL CITIZENSHIP AT LSU IN LOBBYING THE LOUISIANA STATE LEGISLATURE TO PROTECT THE EXISTING LAWS ALLOWING PERSONS FROM THE AGES OF 18-20 YEARS TO ENTER AND WORK IN ESTABLISHMENTS SERVING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

**PARAGRAPH 1:** WHEREAS, UNDER THE PROPOSED LOUISIANA STATE LAW, PERSONS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 18 AND 20 WILL NOT BE ABLE TO WORK IN ESTABLISHMENTS THAT RECEIVE OVER 50% OF PROFIT FROM THE SALE OF ALCOHOL, AND

**PARAGRAPH 2:** WHEREAS, MANY LSU STUDENTS IN THE SERVICE INDUSTRY WILL BE AFFECTED BY THIS PROPOSED LAW, AND

**PARAGRAPH 3:** WHEREAS, PEOPLE FROM THE AGES FROM 18 TO 20 YEARS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER SUCH AN ESTABLISHMENT, AND

**PARAGRAPH 4:** WHEREAS, THE PROPOSED LAW WILL AFFECT THE SOCIAL OPPORTUNITIES OF THE STUDENTS IN THIS AGE BRACKET.

**PARAGRAPH 5:** THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE LSU A&M STUDENT SENATE EXPRESSES SUPPORT FOR THE SOCIETY FOR EQUAL CITIZENSHIP AT LSU IN LOBBYING THE LOUISIANA STATE LEGISLATURE TO PROTECT THE EXISTING LAWS ALLOWING PERSONS FROM THE AGES OF 18-20 YEARS TO ENTER AND WORK IN ESTABLISHMENTS SERVING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.
