A Bill

1 TO APPROPRIATE A MAXIMUM OF TEN
2 THOUSAND AND EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY DOLLARS
3 (\$10,880) FROM THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT
4 INITIATIVES ACCOUNT TO THE LSU CENTER FOR
5 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT, LEARNING, AND
6 LEADERSHIP (CCELL) TO FUND THE CREATION OF
7 EIGHT (8) NEW SERVICE-LEARNING COURSE

9 WHEREAS, The Center for Community Engagement,
10 learning, and Leadership (CCELL) facilitates classes
11 in which students provide a community service that
12 enhances their learning; and

13 WHEREAS, research shows that service-learning
14 promotes a deeper understanding of course content
15 while giving students the opportunity to give back to
16 their community and connect with the people around
17 them; and

18 WHEREAS, With more than 90 faculty each year to
19 develop approximately 170 classes in 40 different LSU
20 departments; and

 WHEREAS, more than 3,500 students partner with
 100 community non-profit organizations to provide
 community service that enhances their learning; and

 WHEREAS, the funding of these new potential classes
 is a one time expenditure as these classes are self-
 sustaining over time; and

WHEREAS, the base funding required for each course creation shall be as follows:

\$1000 x 8 graduate student scholars = \$8000

And the inclusion of fringe benefit allocations shall be as follows:

\$360 for fringe* x 8 graduate student scholars
= \$2,880

And the LSU Office of Accounting Services defines Fringe Benefits as the following:

Louisiana State University provides to various employees certain fringe benefits funded directly with University funds and indirectly through funding from affiliated support organizations, including—but not limited to—the LSU Foundation, the Alumni Association and the Tiger Athletic Foundation. Examples of fringe benefits include awards, employer provided vehicles and moving expenses. Fringe Benefits may be taxable or nontaxable to the employee according to IRS regulations for each type of benefit. For further explanation, please see FASOP AS-12 .

WHEREAS, if the fringe benefits allocation is later determined to be unnecessary for course creation, then that \$2,880 allocation shall not be utilized.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT OF Louisiana STATE UNIVERSITY AGRICULTURAL AND MECHANICAL COLLEGE THAT A MAXIMUM OF TEN THOUSAND AND EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY DOLLARS (\$10,880) FROM THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT INITIATIVES ACCOUNT TO THE LSU CENTER FOR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT, LEARNING, AND LEADERSHIP (CCELL) TO FUND THE CREATION OF EIGHT (8) NEW SERVICE-LEARNING COURSE

22 THIS BILL SHALL TAKE EFFECT UPON PASSAGE BY A
23 TWO-THIRDS (2/3) VOTE OF THE LSU STUDENT SENATE
24 AND SIGNATURE BY THE PRESIDENT, UPON LAPSE OF
25 TIME FOR PRESIDENTIAL ACTION, OR IF VETOED BY
26 THE PRESIDENT AND SUBSEQUENTLY APPROVED BY
27 THE SENATE, ON THE DATE OF SUCH APPROVAL.
